Words are magic. They have the power to express, connect, and transform.

As a parent, you likely have many words to describe your child. But what if you asked your child what word they'd choose to describe themselves?

Here's what to do:

- Get supplies:
 - -Poster board
 - -Construction paper (cut into strips)
- Ask your child the big question—the one word that sums them up. The word that makes them, them.
- Have him or her write it down and stick it to the construction paper.
- The next questions are up for grabs—but all with single-word answers: How are you feeling right now? What's your favorite animal? Who's your best friend? What's your favorite word all time?
- Post each one until you have a collage of words—a mini-memoir of who they are, right now.
- In the center, add one with your child's name and the date.

Next year, same time, do it again. You'll be amazed at your child's sense of self-discovery and their awareness of the world around them. (Even if their best friend never changes.)

BONUS! Word collages can also make a great addition to birthday parties. Have each guest write down the one word that expresses what they like about the birthday boy or girl. A day to remember filled with glowing reviews!





Friendship is one of the first words your child will come to understand. But when asked, what single word would your child use to describe their best friend?

Here's what to do:

- Gather supplies:
 - —Poster board (for each child)
 - —Construction paper (cut into squares)
- At the top of the poster board have each child write "All About My Best Friend."
- Ask each child a question about their best friend that requires a single-word answer: What's their favorite color? Favorite animal? Favorite sport? Favorite day? Favorite subject in school? Happiest word? What's their friend's best quality? Have them write down each answer on a square of construction paper and glue or tape them down to the poster board. And no peeking!
- Next, have them exchange collages.

Children will not only discover what they have in common, but they'll see themselves through the eyes of their best friend. That means a lot, and the friendship collage will be something to hold onto and cherish.

Perfect Scratch Art

Follow these steps to help your child create their own scratch art masterpiece!

Materials:

- Sturdy white art paper or cardstock
- Oil pastels or crayons
- Black tempera paint
- Small paintbrush or foam brush
- Toothpick, plastic fork, chopstick, or other tool that works as a stylus

Instructions:

Step 1: Protect your surface by covering your work area with newspaper.

Step 2: Using oil pastels or crayons, let your child color in the entire sheet of paper in as many colors as possible—the more colors the better.

Step 3: With a paintbrush or foam brush, help your child to completely paint over the colored-in paper until the entire sheet is black. (This may require two coats.)

Step 4: After the paint has dried thoroughly, have your child use a toothpick or other stylus to scratch shapes or words to reveal their colorful scratch art!



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
