
Encourage and create comics inspired by Dav Pilkey's Cat Kid Comic Club and Dog Man series!

REPRODUCIBLES IN THIS KIT

- **DOG MAN AND FRIENDS PUPPETS:** Invite retellings of Dog Man books with puppets so students can demonstrate an understanding of the story and recall key details to describe characters, settings, and major events.
- **STORY IDEAS:** Reinforce parts of speech while encouraging creative brainstorming.
- TRY, TRY AGAIN!: Make several copies of this page for each student so they can be free to experiment and try several different story lines without any pressure of perfection. This narrative writing exercise allows students to introduce a character and organize an event sequence that unfolds naturally, as well as use dialogue to show the response of characters to situations.
- **DRAWING WITH PERSPECTIVE:** In addition to a fun art lesson in linear perspective drawing, introduce STEM concepts with this exercise by having students expand upon it by creating one- or two-point perspective drawings of a city skyline.
- **SHOWING EMOTIONS:** Highlight the CASEL 5 Social Awareness competency as students demonstrate empathy and compassion while exploring synonyms for various emotions.
- **LIGHTS! CAMERA! ACTION!:** Invite students to work in groups to either write scripts for their own creative endings for this scene using descriptive details and clear event sequences or to transcribe words and actions from the book to complete it. Practicing teamwork and creative problem-solving is at the heart of the CASEL 5 Relationship Skills competency. Have your student groups perform scenes for other classes!
- **FIND YOUR PURPOSE FLOW CHART:** Here's a fun exercise for kids to zero in on what types of pursuits most appeal to them. Developing interests and a sense of purpose is a key component of the CASEL 5 Self-Awareness competency.

Take a story idea from the previous worksheet and try it out!




























DRAWING WITH PERSPECTIVE








FIND YOUR PURPOSE FLOW CHART


ABOUT THE CAT KID COMIC CLUB SERIES
